- (1) Total summer jobs: **CUT 27% FROM 10,173 to 7,427**. That's a drop of **2746 jobs**.
- (2) Most cuts come from federal cuts to ABCD and stimulus jobs. Some come from private cuts.
- (3) The City kept the same amount of funding (\$4.6 million).
- (4) The City is still using \$596,432 from lawsuits which they used before for year-round jobs.

## State Summer Jobs Funding

The State passed \$4 million in "supplemental funding" for YouthWorks and \$2 million for School to Career. That's **HALFWAY** to the \$12.4 million we are asking for.

However, the House Ways and Means Committee released its budget on April 13, 2011 with **\$0 for YouthWorks and School-to-Career**. This would keep money at \$6 million instead of \$12.4 million, a cut of about **868 jobs in Boston**.

# **How many jobs are we losing?**

It's not clear if the 868 jobs missing from the State budget are part of the 27% cut (2746 jobs), or if that would be an **extra** 868 jobs cut. So we're looking at:
